#### From Rev. Dr. Alex Yesudas:

#### **Pentecost and Great Commission**

According to the Christian calendar, we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost in June. Pentecost, originally a Jewish festival celebrating the end of the wheat harvest, occurs 50 days after Passover and involves various feasts. It was during this significant occasion that the apostles, gathered after Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection, encountered a "mighty rushing wind." They witnessed "tongues of fire" and were suddenly able to understand each other's languages effortlessly. This miraculous ability, known as speaking in tongues, is directly attributed to the presence of the Holy Spirit. Filled with the Holy Spirit, Peter boldly proclaimed to the crowd, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins may be forgiven; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit" (Acts 2:38). The result? Over 3,000 individuals were baptized that very day.

So, what is the significance of Pentecost? Firstly, the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost stands as a powerful affirmation that Jesus keeps His promises. Today, people of all ages, genders, races, and backgrounds who accept Jesus as their Lord and Savior are granted new life through the Holy Spirit. This unity and inclusivity, fostered by the Holy Spirit, emphatically underscores the Church's mission. Secondly, Pentecost marks the definitive birthday of the Church. In the Old Testament, God's people were primarily confined to Israel. However, Pentecost decisively heals the divisions and animosities that arose from the Tower of Babel (Genesis 11:1-9), where pride and arrogance separated people by language and race. At Pentecost, the outpouring of the Holy Spirit unites individuals from every tongue, race, and nation under Jesus Christ. Finally, Pentecost reinforces the Church's primary purpose: to proclaim the love of Jesus to the ends of the earth. Throughout the remaining chapters of Acts, the Apostles and all of Jesus' followers commit to spreading God's love.

Harry Boer, in his book "Pentecost and Mission," vehemently argues that Pentecost—not the Great Commission—was the catalyst for mission thinking in the early Church. While the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20: "Go, and make disciples of all nations; baptize, teach, etc.") is frequently cited, *Continued overleaf...*

Boer asserts that Pentecost was the real motivating force behind early Church missions.

Acts 1:8 unveils this truth: "You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit comes." This power, the very essence of the Holy Spirit, serves as the driving force behind our mission and witness. The command to "Go, make disciples" is intrinsically linked to the promise, "You will receive power." You cannot have one without the other. The Great Commission equips the Church with instructions, while Pentecost supplies the initiation, initiative, and power. (See the exciting stories in Acts 2, 3, 4, etc.) It is the Holy Spirit that directs and empowers us in our mission. In conclusion, Pentecost stands at the forefront of the Christian Church, fundamentally shaping its nature and mission. When we discuss the mission of the Church, we must go beyond the Great Commission and recognize that the real power for mission is founded in the Pentecost experience. Therefore, the Church's work of mission must be deeply rooted in the personal Pentecost experiences of Alex every member.
